Virtual Disc Golf Competition

The Virtual Disc Golf Competition will be a putting competition. There will be two game scenarios:

- (1) Putting with a basket;
- (2) Putting at a marked square on a wall or tree, or using a wheelbarrow.

The following pages provide information regarding the two scenarios:

- How to prepare for the competition,
- How to mark the distance for the competition,
- How to score for the competition,
- What will be used in the event of a tie breaker.

Number of times you can play

You can submit up to five (5) submissions for each of the categories.

How to submit you scores

- 1. Start no earlier than 0800 EST on Monday 6 July 2020
- 2. Record your scores on the included scorecard.
- 3. Write you name somewhere near the scorecard.
- 4. Take a picture of your scorecard.

Game 1: Putting with Basket

Material Needs:

Basket Disc(s) Tape Measure Means to mark the distances on the ground

A. Measure the following distances from the center of the basket: 5 feet, 7 feet, 10 feet. (See "how to measure instructions)

B. From each distance putt 3 times. With scoring as follows:

- 1 point for each putt made at 5 & 7 feet
- 2 points for each putt made at 10 feet
- 1 bonus point if you make all three putts at either 5 or 7
- 2 bonus points if you make all three putts at 10 feet

For Example:

- From 5 feet, make all 3 = 4 points (1 point for each made, plus 1 bonus for making all 3)
- From 7 feet, miss the first and last, but make second = 1 point (1 point for making 1)
- From 10 feet, make the first and third but miss the second = 4 points (2 points for each made)
- Total score = 9 points

TIE BREAKER

After completing the required format, select a distance from the basket. It can be one of the ones you already played from, or ANY distance of your choosing. Which means you can choose 1 foot, or 25 feet. Attempt one putt from the distance, and record whether the putt was made or not. This information will be used in the case of a tie breaker.

For example, two participants tie for first place with 12 points. Participant "A" takes their extra putt from 3 feet and makes the putt. Participant "B" takes their extra putt from 4 feet, but misses the putt. Participant "A" would be the winner, for making their putt, however "if" participant "B" had made their putt from 4 feet, participant "B" would be the winner because their putt was made from a greater distance.

How to Measure for Game 1

Place the end of the tape measure against the base of the basket's pole. From there mark spots 5 feet, 7 feet, and 10 feet.



Positioning for the Putt

Ensure the "stance" of your feet and chair are behind the designated line.



A "made" putt is when the disc comes to rest inside of the basket, either caught by the chains or comes to rest in the bottom of the catching basket.

Game 2: Putting to Wall, Tree, or into a wheelbarrow

Material Needs: Wall, Tree, or wheelbarrow Disc(s) Tape Measure Means to mark the distance on the ground

A. Mark the wall / tree 30 inches from the ground, and 50 inches from the ground, and 30 inches across at the top and bottom (make a box). Tree should be at least 30 inches across, and a wall, one that won't mar if you hit it with a disc. (See instructions for "how to measure for game 2" and "mark the box.")

B. Measure the following distances from the wall, tree, or wheelbarrow: 5 feet, 7 feet, 10 feet.

C. From each distance putt 3 times, with the goal to hit the wall/tree in between the marked area. NOTE: If you hit the "marked" area count the putt as if you made the putt. If using a wheelbarrow, discs must stay within the wheelbarrow. With scoring as follows:

- 1 point for each putt made at 5, & 7 feet
- 2 points for each putt made at 10 feet
- 1 bonus point if you make all three putts at 5, & 7 feet
- 2 bonus points if you make all three putts at 10 feet

For Example:

- From 5 feet, make all 3 = 4 points (1 point for each made, plus 1 bonus for making all 3)
- From 7 feet, miss the first and last, but make second = 1 point (1 point for making 1)
- From 10 feet, make the first and third but miss the second = 4 points (2 points for each made)
- Total score = 9 points

TIE BREAKER

After completing the required format, select a distance from the basket. It can be one of the ones you already played from, or ANY distance of your choosing. Which means you can choose 1 foot, or 25 feet. Attempt one putt from the distance, and record whether the putt was made or not. This information will be used in the case of a tie breaker.

For example, two participants tie for first place with 12 points. Participant "A" takes their extra putt from 3 feet and makes the putt. Participant "B" takes their extra putt from 4 feet, but misses the putt. Participant "A" would be the winner. For making their putt, however "if" participant "B" had made their putt from 4 feet, participant "B" would be the winner because their putt was made from a greater distance.

How to Measure for Game 2

Place the end of the tape measure against the base of the wall, tree, or wheelbarrow. From there mark spots 5 feet, 7 feet, and 10 feet.



Mark the Box

From the base of the tree / wall measure 30 inches up. Mark / tape a line 30 inches across. From the base of the tree / wall, measure 50 inches up. Mark / tape a line 30 inches across. Mark the sides from the bottom to the top to make a square. The square will be 30 inches wide and 20 inches in height.

Positioning for the Putt

Ensure the "stance" of your feet and chair are behind the designated line. A "made" putt is when the disc hits on the line or inside the marked square or stays within the wheelbarrow.
